ARTWORK PROSPECTUS

Peace Arch International Park is the Western United States International Gateway to the 2010 Olympic Games in Vancouver, BC, Canada. In the spirit of the international goodwill of the games, the USCPAA is pleased to announce that our Thirteenth Annual Peace Arch Park International Sculpture Exhibition will open May 1st, 2010, and will run through October 1st, 2010.

The deadline to submit your artwork consideration for the exhibition is Friday February 19th, 2010.



Peace Arch International Park is located on the US/Canada border between Blaine, Washington and Surrey, British Columbia. The 40 acre peace park that surrounds the Peace Arch is the location of this annual outdoor sculpture exhibition. Each year, the park's picturesque landscape and magnificent gardens host family gatherings, picnics, weddings, and annual events of international significance. Over 500,000 visitors tour this international historic site annually.

The mission of the international fine arts program is to serve as a catalyst in the development of International fine artists, while creating a greater awareness and appreciation of the Peace Arch and the International Park. A self guided tour brochure featuring the exhibition and park history accompanies the six month long exhibit.

Selection Process & Criteria

The International Artwork Selection and Award Committee, comprised of art experts, international park management, and association members, will review and jury submitted artwork and select the exhibition. The criteria for selecting the art include: quality, durability, park appropriateness, and aesthetic appeal. Artists may submit up to three entries for consideration. However, if selected, only the highest ranking of the three entries would be featured in the Peace Arch Park International Sculpture Exhibition. All submissions not accepted for the Peace Arch Park International Sculpture Exhibition will be considered by the USCPAA for display in our "Art by the Bay" exhibit in the "Peace Arch City" Blaine, Washington.

Exhibition Timeline

- February 19th, 2010, call for artwork submissions deadline.
- February 23rd, 2010, the International Artwork Selection and Awards Committee will review artwork submissions and select the exhibition.
- April 10th, 2010, artwork installation day.
- May 1st, 2010 to October 1st, 2010, International Sculpture Exhibition.
- Saturday May 29th, 2010, Grand Opening Ceremony.
- October 2nd -15th, 2010, artwork removal from Peace Arch Park.

Rules Of Entry

1. Open to all sculptors.
2. All works must be original outdoor sculptures.
3. A 33% commission will be taken on all sculptures sold during the exhibition.
4. All works must be in a suitable form of presentation. The organizers of the competition reserve the right to refuse any work not considered acceptable for presentation.
5. An entry may be a single object or set. Site specific works proposals are acceptable.
6. Artists or their agents are responsible for transport and insure of their artworks to and from Peace Arch Park. Artwork shall be delivered and picked up at designated dates and times. If accepted work is shipped to the park, the artist must pay all shipping, handling, and insurance costs both ways, (Further details will be provided following acceptance). 7. Accepted artwork is to be delivered and installed in the park by the artist or by his/her representative at sites designated by park management. All entries must be accompanied by a diagram or description of the installation process. All sculptures must be secured for safety and security purposes (rebar & ready mix will be supplied by the United States Canada Peace Anniversary Association "USCPAA" on artwork installation day).
8. During the exhibition period each accepted artwork will be insured by the USCPAA.
9. The USCPAA is not responsible for damage, loss or theft of slides or CD 's or digital images.
10. Works selected for the competition must remain in the exhibition until it closes (May 1st, 2010 to October 1st, 2010). No exceptions.
11. The International Artwork Selection Committee may reject any piece that differs markedly from the work depicted on the accepted slide or digital images.
12. There is a \$200 (US Funds) travel / shipping stipend for each accepted artist who becomes an exhibitor (reimbursement).

Digital Images (CD) & Slide Entries

1. All entries must arrive on or before 5 PM, on Friday, February 19th, 2010.
2. Each artist may submit up to three entries. Two detailed images per piece is acceptable, but not required.
3. Artists may include a single page resume and a 25 word or less narrative for each entry submitted.
4. All submissions must be 35mm slides, in cardboard or plastic mounts or digital image files on CD. A) Slides: hold the slide so you can see the image correctly. The side facing you is the face of the slide. Mark each entry with the artists name, dimensions. Arrow indicating top, and number corresponding entry with entry form. B) Digital Image Files: images must be 4" x 6" and no greater than 200 resolution can be submitted by e-mail entry or disk. If you would like to submit by e-mail contact the USCPAA prior to sending. Be sure to write Peace Arch Park Exhibition in your the e-mail's subject box.
5. A nonrefundable entry fee of \$10.00 per piece (U.S. funds) must accompany the entry form. Email entries will be invoiced for their entry fee(s) via PayPal. Make checks payable to: United States/Canada Peace Anniversary Association. Mail to: USCPAA, P.O. Box 4564 Blaine, Washington, 98231-4564 USA. Include slides, entry form, entry fee and self addressed stamped envelope (SASE) for return of slides (Canadians may add \$3 U.S. Funds) in lieu of providing return postage.)
6. Images of selected artwork will be held until the opening of the exhibition and may be used for publicity purposes. Slides not accepted will be returned to the artist only if a self addressed stamped envelope (SASE) is included with your entry.



Artists selected for the exhibition will be notified by February 28th, 2010.
